### A Look Back . . .

Our chapter's 2017-18 program year began with a time of great fellowship and food at the Black Pearl Restaurant. In October, we held our annual scholarship auditions at Our Lady of Lourdes. Dr. Scott Hyslop (St. Lorenz Lutheran Church in Frankenmuth, MI) gave an interesting presentation on Paul Manz and his organ works at Community of Christ Lutheran a week later. Dr. Brad Pierson (UT) led our Sacred Choral Music Festival in November at Christ Presbyterian. He directed a chorus of 50; the service was enthusiastically enjoyed by nearly 150 people.

We started off 2018 with a seminar on registration and service playing at St. Rose Catholic Church; the program featured the expertise of members of our chapter. In February, we were treated to a "Super Organ Recital" at Zoar Lutheran, again presented by members of our chapter to a large and appreciative audience. Six students performed in our annual student recital at Our Lady of Lourdes in March; it was an enjoyable afternoon and showed off our young talent. In April, we went an organ crawl to St. Martin de Porres, St. Paul United Methodist, Immaculate Conception, Pilgrim Congregational and St. Petri Lutheran Churches. We'll end our year with Matt Bickett in recital at Monroe Street UMC and our annual banquet.

It's been a busy year, but a very successful one filled with great musical moments. We shared our music and love for the organ with each other and with our community. ### May Recital Announcement

Organist Matt Bickett will present at recital on Sunday, May 6 at 4:00 p.m. at Monroe Street United Methodist Church in Toledo. The recital is sponsored by the Toledo Chapter of the AGO (American Guild of Organists) and the Monroe Street UMC's Concert Series. Matt, the winner of the 2017 Great Lakes Regional AGO/Quimby RCYO (Regional Competitions for Young Artists), is a student at Oberlin College and has been accepted into the conservatory's accelerated Master of Music in Historical Performance degree program.. His impressive program will feature works by Bach, Mendelssohn, Gigout, Florence Beatrice Price, Rheinberger, and will conclude with Dupré's *Symphonie-Passion*. A freewill offering will be collected.

#### Matt Bickett

Matt Bickett, from Portsmouth, Ohio, is a fourth-year student at Oberlin College and Conservatory, where he pursues a Bachelor of Arts in Religion and a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance. While still a candidate for both degrees, he was accepted into Oberlin Conservatory's accelerated Master of Music in Historical Performance degree program. His work focuses on musicologically-informed approaches to historical styles of organ and harpsichord playing. He currently studies organ with Jonathan Moyer, harpsichord with Mark Edwards, composition with Elizabeth Ogonek, and conducting with Gregory Ristow, and has coached with Marie-Louise Langlais, George Ritchie, and Bruce Neswick.



Alongside his work at Oberlin College and Conservatory, Matt serves as Assistant Organist and Choirmaster at Christ Episcopal Church, Oberlin, where he plays for liturgies and assists in directing the semi-professional choir. In 2017, Matt established the Oberlin Cantata Project, a period orchestra and choir specializing in 17th- and 18th-century concerted vocal music. Recent performances have taken the ensemble to Cleveland venues where Matt led the group in performances of sacred cantatas by D. Buxtehude and J. S. Bach. As organist, he has performed at notable venues such as St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral in Seattle, Washington; Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, Oregon; St. Columba Cathedral in Youngstown, Ohio; and in Cleveland, Ohio at Church of the Covenant and Trinity Lutheran Church. Recently, Matt was awarded the Presser Fellowship from the Presser Foundation and took first prize in the Great Lakes Regional AGO Quimby Organ Competition.

(1920's Kilgen organ)
- Pilgrim Congregational Church, 1375 Sylvania Ave.  
(1971 Brombaugh tracker organ)
- St. Petri Lutheran Church, 3120 S. Byrne Road  
(1974 Casavant organ)


