Dean's Message

Greetings,

Our annual student scholarship auditions in October was a great event with five high schoolers! Five! It was great to hear them play and realize that there are young people who are interested in playing the organ and increasing their skills. Thank you to Denise Mathias for coordinating the auditions, and thank you to our judges: Paul Monachino, Joan McConnell and Randy Currie.

The scholarships that we award are possible due to the generosity of others. If you would like to make a contribution to our scholarship fund,—it's tax deductible—mail a check to or contact Pam Davis. (After the auditions, a family member of one the students who auditioned expressed her thanks to our chapter by donating \$100 to the fund!)

So, back to the topic at hand. Let's each do our part to maintain and generate that interest!

How can you promote and encourage interest in the organ? Some possibilities include asking children or youth (or even an adult!) to assist you by turning pages, pulling stops or changing pistons for you. Introduce the organ to children or adults by giving them a short "guided tour" of the organ. Maybe this could be done after a service, as a part of a choir rehearsal or during Sunday School class. Let children and adults sit on the organ bench and play a little. I always ask if they want to play soft, medium or loud, and then I pull out an appropriate stop and let them play. You may have ideas you have used that have worked well. If so, please share them!

Another idea is to invite others to one of our programs. In January, we are sponsoring a workshop which will deal with aspects of playing the organ. This program, which is being planned by our Sub-Dean Dennis Johns, is open to all interested organists and will address areas of organ playing that will benefit organists of various levels of experience, including new organists.

In February, we are sponsoring a Member's Recital at Zoar Lutheran Church. This is an opportunity for you to play a piece or two and to invite others to attend! More information about how you can participate will be in our December newsletter. Think about who you can invite to both of these events.

Our Choral Festival is on Sunday, November 19 at Christ Presbyterian Church. So far, we have choir members from four churches who will join together in song under the direction of Brad Pierson, Director of Choral Activities at UT. I do not have a head count yet, but it appears that we will have at least forty and maybe even fifty-plus singers! **Individual singers can also join us, so please consider doing so. Please invite others to attend the closing service/concert at 7 p.m. that evening.** A flyer and a sample announcement are included in this newsletter which I encourage you to post, submit for your church's bulletin or share with others. Please see the article in this newsletter or contact for more information.

I hope to see each of you at one (or more) of our upcoming programs!




Five high school students participated in the auditions: Benjamin Garst, Enrico Taberero, Kurt Muller, Jordan Brosten and Skyelar Raiti. The participating teachers were Pam Davis, Charlotte Mariasy and Mark Mathias. These students were prepared with the required repertoire and handled the stress of auditions beautifully. Congratulations to them, their teachers and their parents!

Awards were given as follows: Benjamin Garst and Enrico Taberero--\$100 scholarships, Kurt Muller--\$200, Jordan Brosten--\$300, and Skyelar Raiti--\$400. 
